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Offside	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A player who moves into an incorrect playing area and self-corrects should not be penalised for offside. Players may “play on” in the case of simultaneous offside (one player touches the ball), rather than a toss up being taken. Players should be given guidance if they move into offside areas and should not be penalised at the first instance. If a player regularly goes offside, even after guidance is given, they may be penalised. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Usual offside rule applies, with consideration given to the age and skill level of the players. Players may “play on” in the case of simultaneous offside (one player touches the ball), rather than a toss up being taken. If a player regularly goes offside (and does not seem aware that they are breaking the rules), they should be given guidance about the correct playing area/s for their position when penalised. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Rule 9.7 Offside (Rules of Netball Page 53)

Obstruction	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Players should be given guidance if they are obstructing (i.e. defending from a distance of less than 1.2m or have arms away from the body so as to limit the movement of an opponent and should not be penalised at the first instance.
