## **Athlete Code of Conduct**

- Play by the rules
- Play to the best of your ability
- Be a good sport

- Treat all athletes as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another.

- Never argue with an official. If you disagree, discuss the matter with your coach after the game.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials, other athletes, or provoking an opponent is not acceptable.
- Avoid using derogatory language. Swearing or profanity is unacceptable
- Do not use drugs or undertake in the use of prohibited substances or practices
- Behave in an orderly and respectable manner at all times. You are a representative of the BNA & are expected to behave in a manner as to not damage the integrity or good character of this association and netball as a sport.

## **Parent & Spectator Code of Conduct**

- Encourage children to participate and play always according to the rules.
- Cheer for your child and their team, but remember that the coach is the director of the team and plays.
- Show respect to all athletes, coaches and officials.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake.
- Never argue with an official. If you disagree, raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than questioning an official's judgment or honesty in public.
- Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour by not using foul language or harassing athletes, coaches or officials
- Remember that children learn best from example. Applaud good plays by all teams.
- Support all efforts to remove all physical and verbal abuse from sporting activities.
